INTRODUCTION

Description of Resources:

The Oral History Project of Atlanta is a collection of oral histories of people from the Atlanta area who are Jewish. It began with 50 Jewish women of achievement and grew into people and families with a history or historical significance to the Atlanta area. Included are audio recordings with transcripts, and in many cases photographs of the individuals. As the information is completed, it is moved to the Archives at the William Bremen Jewish Heritage Museum. (See the section on the William Bremen Jewish Heritage Museum)

The American Jewish Committee has materials regarding its existence back to about 1969. Records beginning 1945 for the Atlanta chapter are probably in the main office of the AJC in New York City.

Finding Aid

An up-to-date list is kept at the American Jewish Committee and the Heritage Center of the Atlanta Jewish Federation.

Fees/Copies:

Copies of audio recordings and transcripts are available to families of the individuals at the AJF Archives.

Directions:

To use the Project's records, visit the Special Collections and Archives Division which is located on the 10th floor of the Robert W. Woodruff Library at Emory University. From downtown Atlanta take Interstate 85 north, Exit North Druid Hills Road (Exit 31 - East). Follow North Druid Hills Road about 1/2 mile to Briarcliff Road and turn right. Turn left after several miles onto Clifton Road. Turn right on Asbury Circle which is directly past the hospital on the right. The library will be on the left.

Description of Resources:

The Witness To The Holocaust Project compiles information which pertains primarily to the liberators of the Holocaust. This includes interviews, photographs, and books dating back to 1945. The project began in 1978. Many of the interviews and photographs are available online at their website.

Another collection which may be of interest to genealogists of Jewish family history is an oral history project called "The Pekyl" which is located in a manuscript collection called New South Miscellany. The description reads as follows: Materials relating to the oral history project: "The Pekyl: Folk/Histories of Jewish Peddlers in the South, 1890-1914" by Ruth D. Scheinberg. Included are a copy of the corrected typescript of this writing (August 1980) and 11 audiocassettes of interviews conducted by Scheinberg with descendants of Jewish peddlers. A detailed listing of the interviews is available in Special Collections.

The interviews are stored in Emory University's Robert W. Woodruff Library in the Special Collections and Archives Division.

Directions:

From downtown Atlanta, take GA 400 North to I-285 East. Exit Chamblee Dunwoody Road north on the right by turning left. The library is located inside the JF& CS (Jewish Family and Career Services) building which will be located on the right after about ½ mile.

Description of Resources:

The library houses over 7,000 books including those of the Jewish Genealogical Society of Georgia. Microfiche issued by the International Association of Jewish Genealogical Societies is housed here.

Finding Aid

The library catalog is available on the website noted above. It can be searched by by title, author, and subject. Genealogical newsletters are arranged by locality.

Description of Facility:

The library is sponsored by grants from primarily the Atlanta Jewish Federation. Seating is available for about 12 people. There is one microfiche reader which does not allow for photocopies. Internet access is also available to genealogical sources of interest.

Fees/Copies:

Photocopies are 10 cents each. Use of the library and microfilm is free. To check out material there is a membership fee of \$10 for the general public and \$5 for teachers, genealogical society members and other agency employees.

Finding Aid

Materials are neatly labeled with contents. A contents list and information is available on their website and at the archives.

Description of Facility:

The Ida Pearle and Joseph Cuba Archives and Genealogical Center of The William Breman Jewish Heritage Museum is the largest repository of its type in the Southeast. Its holdings of personal and family papers and organizational records which include diaries, minutes, scrapbooks, and photographs, audio and video recordings, oral histories as well as an extensive newspaper collection, enable the visitor to do research through the use of original source material.

Over 300 manuscript collections and 10,000 photographs support study in Georgia Jewish history, genealogy, and the Holocaust. Cemetery records, family histories, synagogue membership records, population studies and a small collection of Yizkor books from Jewish communities destroyed during the Holocaust assist genealogists in the search for their roots. A library of secondary source materials which

includes city directories from 1876-1988, journals and synagogue and community publications supplements the manuscript collections.

Fees/Copies:

Photocopies are 25 cents per page and written inquiries are welcome.

Restriction on Use:

Archive is free and open to the public.
